








Infrastructures and databases increase the likelihood of finding and being found




Recommendations when starting a project

- Start with a comprehensive background check
- If information comes from non-validated sources - check the quality
- Optimize dissemination. Putting information on the internet is easy but it should also be found
- If you do not use already existing databases for input, structure and mark-up your information in a standardized/harmonized way
- Plan for sustainability: What will happen with the information after the project/programme has ended?
- Remember to include the cost of the above when applying for grants

Recommendations when funding a project

- Demand that an application include a comprehensive background check and make sure that it's been done before approval
- Encourage the use of already existing soft infrastructures and databases
- Check the information management plan: How will for instance the data and information be accessed after the project/programme has finished?
- Support these activities financially
- Remember that already existing soft infrastructures and databases need your support

the TRIS and ITRD database

- TRIS (TRB) + ITRD (OECD) merged to TRID in 2011
- Multimodal
- Quadrilingual (English, German, French, Spanish)
- Information from start of the project to final report
- Quality-assessed – reliable sources, structured information, checked by information professionals, meta data from controlled vocabulary
- Continuous development and improvements
- Print, download, directly e-mail or share search results
- Subscription to RSS feeds
- Indexed by Google
